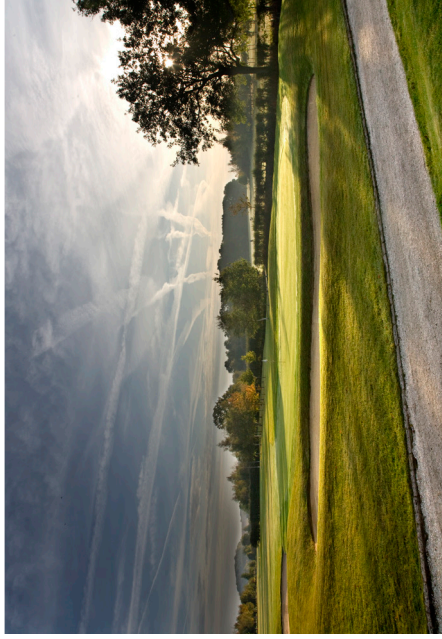

LOCAL RULES

- (1) OUT OF BOUNDS** (Rule 27 applies)
A ball is out of bounds if it lies
- (a) Beyond any boundary fence, hedge or ditch bounding the course.
 - (b) Beyond any line of white stakes.
 - (c) In or on left of the drainage ditch to the left of the 1st fairway which marks the boundary of the Driving Range.
 - (d) Any ball going left of the ditch to the left of the 9th fairway where white stakes appear.
 - (e) When playing the first hole the wood beyond the ditch to the right of the first hole is out of bounds.
 - (f) On or over the path at the back of the 9th green.
- (2) PROTECTED TREES** (Rule 24.2 applies)
Only trees with green tubular guards are deemed to be 'immovable obstructions' and relief may be taken if interference as defined by the rule occurs. All other trees that are staked, tagged or otherwise protected do not qualify for relief.
- (3) HAZARDS** (Rule 26 applies)
(a) Yellow stakes denote water hazards.
(b) Red stakes denote lateral water hazards.
(c) Any path or bridge within the yellow or red hazard markers is deemed to be an integral part of the course. Any ball resting on any such path or bridge must be played as it lies, or dropped under penalty.
- (4) STONES IN BUNKERS** (Rule 24.1 applies)
Stones in bunkers are deemed to be movable obstructions and may be removed without penalty.
- (5) IMMOVABLE OBJECTS** (Rule 24.2 applies)
All internal tracks, course furniture, pylons, wires and stays and sprinkler heads are immovable obstructions and relief may be taken if interference as defined by the rule occurs.
- (6) GROUND UNDER REPAIR** (Rule 25 applies)
(a) Any area indicated as GUR by white line or notice.
(b) All drainage work.
(c) Turf repairs on the greens.
Relief under the rule MUST be taken.
- (7) PYLON**
If the ball in motion strikes the pylon or wires within the course boundary the shot MUST be replayed without penalty.
N.B. Penalty for a breach of the local rules:
Match play - loss of hole. Stroke play - two strokes
